with British Expeditionary Force under Field Marshal French, through serving at the Somme in the Battle of Pozieres Ridge when awarded the Military Cross for Conspicuous Gallantry and when, during the Battle of Transloy, wounded in the chest, he hunkered down in a shellhole all night before being rescued then to serve in the North Russia Expedition Force

to Archangel and Murmansk

UNTIL 1919

Both the BEF and the NREF were fully supported by the USA. then

FROM 1939

he served also during WWII as second-in-command at the HQ of MI9 UNTIL 1946

when

having been awarded the Military Cross twice and Mentioned in Dispatches three times, he retired with honour from the British Army.
