JOAN'S PARENTS

Chief Inspector, BSAP LEONARD JAMES GENET, B.E.M.

b. 1898 in Berwick-upon-Tweed;

1914 at age 16 joined the London Scottish Regiment; 1916 – he was wounded in the Battle of the Somme; his step-brother was R.T.Shepherd, chief test pilot at Rolls Royce for the TMR "Flying Bedstead" VTOL; he tried accountancy work but he did not like it, so in 1922 – he emigrated to Rhodesia to join the BSAP -District Division of the British South Africa Police; he met Rhoda White when stationed at Figtree and on the White family farm "Vreigevight" in the times when police patrols were on horseback; 1927 – he married Rhoda White in Bulawayo served at several District Police Camps until finally Chief of Police at Umtali Police Camp, S. Rhodesia, the senior position in the BSAP District division......Also, Member of the Order of St. John. 1964 – his investiture at Government House, Salisbury with British Empire Medal for Services to the Police; 1965 - he retired at rank of Chief Inspector, BSAP;

- he was appointed Secretary to the Umtali Club; died in **1968** at age 69 in England in Joan's family home.

RHODA CONSTANCE WHITE

b.1902 in Bulawayo; 2nd generation Rhodesian; daughter of Walter and Amelia White of "Vreigevight" farm at Figtree near Bulawayo, Rhodesia, bought in 1898 and owned for 113 years, virtually the period of the Colony and longer, until expropriated by the Mugabe regime in 2012; married in 1927 to Leonard Genet; 1931 - daughter: Joan Elizabeth Genet 1934 - son: Graham George Morris Genet; BSAP Camps-Plumtree, FortVictoria, Umtali; died in 1985 at age 83 in Harare, Zimbabwe.
