father: Henry Heyward Isham, b.1847,d.1922, m.Juliet Calhoun Marsh b.18?? :mother, he became President of the Marietta, Cleveland and Coumbus Railway and inherited the Trumbull estate near Elizabeth, N.J.

b.1890 & d.1955 in NYC

m.Marion Gaynor-1914; Margaret Dorothy Hurt-1924; Christine, Vicountess Churchill-1938

Attended at Cornell University in 1908; Yale College in 1910-11 and N.Y. Law School..

Engaged in big game shooting in Mexico and the Far East.

1916-19 - Enlisted as private in British Army; rose to Lt.Col. on Sir Douglas Haig's staff

1919 - Invested as Commander of the Order British Empire for Army Services.

1920's - Established an office in New York as a banker and financier.

Aquired one of the world's best collections of 18th. century English literature, including his purchase of the Boswell papers from Lord Talbot of Malahide Castle and his discovery, in a trunk, of the manuscript of the Diary of Dr. Samuel Johnson, which were gifted by his son Jonathan Trumbull Isham to the Yale University Library to be known as the "Ralph Heyward Isham Papers" - (MS 1455).

He was a close friend of "Lawrence of Arabia" - T.E.Shaw.

Appointed F.R.G.S. - Fellow of the Royal Geographical Society;

he had 2 sons:-

1 - **Heyward**, b.1927, d.2009

A career Foreign Service officer who played a commanding role as Acting-Chief of American Delegation to the Paris peace talks concerning Vietnam where, "He made a tremendous contribution", according to Mr Henry A. Kissinger; he was appointed US Ambassador to Haiti, during 1947-77.

2 - Jonathan Trumbull, b.1929.
